COVID-19 COMMUNICATION

Dear MUSD Staff and Parents,

The number of COVID-19 cases is on the rise in Arizona, Pinal County, and the Maricopa Unified School District. Over the past three weeks we have quarantined over 1,000 students and staff. You or your child may have been personally impacted by a quarantine and associated shift to distance learning.

We urge you to make a plan in the event that you or your child is asked to quarantine. Unfortunately, we anticipate more confirmed cases, more quarantines, and, in some instances, short-term school closure and shift to all distance learning. Therefore, the MUSD Governing Board adopted protocols that define thresholds for short-term closure/shift to distance learning.
